

Florent Schmitt was a student of Massenet and Fauré, and winner of the coveted Prix de Rome. His impressionistic style blends influences ranging from Debussy to Wagner, with references to Stravinsky and other contemporaries. Conceived as a ballet but revised as a symphonic poem, *La Tragédie de Salomé* depicts Salome's dangerous seductiveness with subtle magnificence. Narrative symbolism also applies to the evocative word painting of the exquisite *Musique sur l'eau*. The perilous saga of *Oriane et le Prince d'Amour* contrasts with the poetic tapestry of orchestral colours in *Légende*, in a version that replaces the original solo saxophone with violin.

As music director of the **Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra**, **JoAnn Falletta** became the first woman to lead a major American ensemble. She is a leading recording artist for Naxos, and won her most recent GRAMMY Award in 2019 for Kenneth Fuchs' *Piano Concerto 'Spiritualist'* (8.559824). Her recording of John Corigliano's *Mr. Tambourine Man: Seven Poems of Bob Dylan* (8.559331) also received two GRAMMY Awards in 2008. Falletta is a member of the esteemed American Academy of Arts and Sciences, a recipient of many of the most prestigious conducting awards and was named *Performance Today's* Classical Woman of the Year 2019.

- Naxos has championed the music of Florent Schmitt in numerous highly successful releases over the years. La Tragédie de Salomé is one of his best-known works, here forming the heart of a programme that also delivers the world premiere recordings of both Musique sur l'eau in its version for voice and orchestra, and Légende in a version with violin and orchestra. This combination of much-loved repertoire with new sonorities in a programme filled with contrast and variety makes this a release of which we are especially proud.
- Other Schmitt releases include chamber works and a piano version of La Tragédie de Salomé (8.572194), but this new programme complements Falletta's previous recording of Anthony and Cleopatra (8.573521), which attracted a great deal of interest and critical acclaim, having 'a ravishing ear for orchestral timbre allied to delicious harmonies, conveyed with finesse by the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra' (BBC Music Magazine).
- British-born Canadian mezzo-soprano Susan Platts brings a uniquely rich and wide-ranging voice to concert and recital repertoire for alto and mezzo-soprano. She has performed widely with distinguished conductors and orchestras, and is particularly esteemed for her performances of
 - Gustav Mahler's works. *Opera News* wrote of her Naxos recording of *Das Lied von der Erde* (8.573536) that 'Susan Platts has few rivals in her generation as a satisfying interpreter of Mahler.'
- Violinist Nikki Chooi has been praised for his passionate and poetic performances and has established himself as an artist of rare versatility, being described as 'vigorous, colourful' by The New York Times. This recording of Schmitt's Légende is his Naxos debut.



Heitor VILLA-LOBOS (1887–1959) **Complete Symphonies**

São Paulo Symphony Orchestra Isaac Karabtchevsky

Heitor Villa-Lobos has been described as 'the single most significant creative figure in 20th-century Brazilian art music'. The eleven symphonies - the enigmatic Symphony No. 5 has never been found and may not even have been written - range from the two earliest, conceived in a broadly central European tradition, to the final Symphony No. 12 which is notable for its explosive energy, harmonic richness and rhythmic vitality. Every aspect of Villa-Lobos's remarkable inspiration is represented in these works, with Brazilian national rhythms and extremes of ambition in terms of scale and dramatic content, alongside neo-Classical transparency and lyrical charm. These critically acclaimed performances from São Paulo are both idiomatic and expertly played.

About Isaac Karabtchevsky

Artistic director and conductor of the Orquestra Petrobras Sinfônica, Isaac Karabtchevsky is also artistic director of the Baccarelli Institute and the Heliopolis Symphony Orchestra. He was awarded the Prêmio da Música Brasileira four times (2014, 2015, 2016 and 2018) for his recordings of the complete symphonies of Villa-Lobos with the Orquestra Sinfônica do Estado de São Paulo (OSESP). He has served as the musical director of the Teatro La Fenice. the Orchestre National des Pays de la Loire and the Tonkunstler

- The combination of the São Paulo Symphony Orchestra (OSESP) with Brazilian conductor Isaac Karabtchevsky created an irresistible synergy with the music of their fellow countryman, and after the final volume of this complete Villa-Lobos symphonies edition appeared in 2017, these six discs have been the principal reference for these works.
- Each release of this edition was received with almost universal acclaim. Symphonies Nos. 3 & 4 (8.573151) were considered 'serious and enjoyable works, and it's great to see them getting the attention they deserve from the composer's compatriots' by ClassicsToday.com, and 'these new performances present both symphonies in the best possible light, the playing the most refined these works have had on disc' for Gramophone.
- The OSESP's involvement in the ongoing 'Music of Brazil' series has produced two releases. The Villa-Lobos Concertos for Guitar and Harmonica (8.574018) received a 10/10 score from ClassicsToday.com: 'Uniformly first-rate performances by members of the São Paulo Symphony...making the whole disc a joy from start to finish'. The succeeding release of Camargo Guarnieri's Choros (8.574197), also conducted by Karabtchevsky, was released in August 2020.
- This set compliments the 3-disc set of the Villa-Lobos Complete Guitar Manuscripts (8.503289), 'a fascinating insight into the Brazilian composer's music for the instrument' (BBC Music Magazine), as well as the complete Bachianas brasileiras (8.557460-62): 'a wonderful new cycle of this richly rewarding and vibrant music' (ClassicsToday.com).

Czech-born composer Jaromír Weinberger, best known for his opera *Schwanda the Bagpiper*, was forced to flee to America in order to escape Nazi terror. *Frühlingsstürme*, staged in 1933 but soon closed down by the Nazi government, was the last operetta of the Weimar Republic. It is filled with cultural complexity, combining serious operatic style with light comedy, and presents a thrilling story involving a doomed love affair set against war between Japan and Russia. This lavish production is staged by the award-winning Australian director Barrie Kosky.

- Jaromír Weinberger's Frühlingsstürme is almost totally unknown on recordings. This forgotten work has been painstakingly reconstructed and orchestrated from what remained of the original production, and with adaptations that make it a stage creation for the 21st century rather than a historical recreation, Barrie Kosky's Komische Oper Berlin production is one that was received by critical acclaim and ovations from its audiences.
- This production was reviewed in The New York Times, which described it as 'an invaluable addition to the Komische Oper's repertoire... Tatjana and Roderich's bubbly duets are rich with physical comedy; Lydia and Ito are given lyrical lines that verge on opera. The most famous number has always been Ito's Du wärst für mich die Frau gewesen. It's deservedly an earworm, lightly soaring and believably felt in Tansel Akzeybek's performance.'
- Swiss actor Stefan Kurt has appeared in more than fifty films since 1993, winning awards including as Best Actor in the Geneva International Film Festival for the movie Tod eines Keilers (2006). Soprano Alma Sadé made her Carnegie Hall debut in recital with guitarist Nadav Lev, and is a featured soloist on the soundtrack for the film Forgiveness, which was honoured at the Berlin International Film Festival.
- Soprano Vera-Lotte Boecker has been a member of the ensemble of the Komische Oper Berlin since 2017 after a season with the Stuttgart State Opera that included their acclaimed production of Hans Werner Henze's Der Prinz von Homburg (2.110668 / NBD0115V). Boecker was also a prize-winner at the Vokal Genial vocal competition held by the Konzertgesellschaft of Munich and Bavarian Radio (First Prize, Audience Prize and Orchestra Prize).

Pietro Antonio Cesti was one of the most outstanding champions of 17th-century Venetian opera, and *La Dori* was both his greatest success and a major influence on the genre in the expressiveness of its arias and duets. The story is set in Babylon on the shores of the Euphrates, and is a convoluted and richly tragicomedic tale of lost lovers, disguises and mistaken identities filled with larger-than-life and colourfully costumed characters. This revival of a forgotten masterpiece was acclaimed as 'a production of the highest level in every aspect' (*musicaculturaonline.it*).

Key Features:

• Pietro Antonio Cesti is not well-known today, and aside from a very few arias in recital programmes his music is almost entirely absent from the record catalogues. Modern revivals have struggled with the perplexing complexities of the plot of *La Dori*, but in marking the 350th anniversary of the composer's death this 2019 Innsbruck Early Music Festival production aimed high with the attraction of conductor Ottavio Dantone's renowned Accademia Bizantina providing an instant stamp of quality.

- The stage production manages to avoid some of the pitfalls in the narrative. Director **Stefano Vizioli** 'did a splendid job directing the work, in which he captured the dramatic thrust of each scene, so that they often had an impact in their own right, distinct from the overall narrative, which is not to suggest that this was ignored in any way. In fact, he managed to deliver a clearly constructed staging which helped clarify some of the work's complexities, to the extent that it was reasonably easy to stay in tune with developments. Vizioli also was particularly successful in combining comedy with seriousness so that there was no jarring effect when the drama suddenly jumped from buffoonery to intense sadness' (operawire.com).
- Operawire.com also praised the cast: 'In the title role was soprano Francesca Ascioti, who produced an excellent performance. It was a role which seemed to be ideally suited. She sang with a great deal of freedom, capturing with apparent ease the emotional state of the character, yet always displaying technical surety. Francesca Lombardi Mazzulli sang well, in an intense performance, displaying a pleasing coloratura and ability to ornament the line... In the role of Tolomeo was soprano Emőke Baráth ... giving an impressive performance in what is a convoluted role. She possesses an appealing voice which she used intelligently to craft nicely contoured lines, with delightful embellishments, including a bright coloratura.'

This program represents American orchestral music in all of its verve and expressive variety. Following the sensational success of *Rhapsody in Blue*, Gershwin's *Concerto in F* was his first foray away from jazz bands into the concert hall, recorded here for the first time in a new critical edition by Timothy Freeze based on the composer's own notation and performances. John Harbison's *Remembering Gatsby* is a foxtrot that evokes the sonorities of 1920s dance bands, while Joan Tower's *Sequoia* reflects her fascination with these silent giants of the tree world. Walter Piston's contribution to the development of 20th-century American music cannot be underestimated, and his *Fifth Symphony* successfully blends twelvetone modernity with reflective profundity and a finale that evokes a spirit of joy and optimism.


- This substantial programme of American orchestral works offers superb new recordings of major works that rarely appear on commercial releases, the most significant of which is Walter Piston's masterly Fifth Symphony. There is also a hidden premiere in this recording of Gershwin's Concerto in F, which is the first to be made using The George and Ira Gershwin Critical Edition. This is based on a comprehensive study of manuscript, print and recorded sources, and presents the concerto as it was notated and performed by the composer.
- This new release follows the National Orchestral Institute Philharmonic's (NOIP) previous recording of Bernstein's Songfest (8.559859). The said disc also featured a performance of An American in Paris, which is also the first to use the new Gershwin Critical Edition.
- Pianist Kevin Cole is widely regarded as America's leading interpreter of George Gershwin's music, but his profile was also recently raised through his surviving a rare brain tumour and eight-hour brain surgery. Cole has since resumed his career, remarkably performing all



four of Gershwin's major works for piano and orchestra with the Albany Symphony only eight weeks after this major operation, an event covered widely in the national press in 2019.



Meyerbeer had already won renown in Italy before conquering Paris with a sequence of much-acclaimed grand operas. In a musical climate dominated by Rossini, Meyerbeer's first Italian opera, Romilda e Costanza, earned the still-unknown 26-year-old composer the sobriquet of 'the genius of the Spree'. The work is a rescue opera overlaid with a love triangle, which was written for specific performers, and the passionate intensity of feeling - from lyricism to unfettered virtuosity - reflects the semiseria nature of the opera. It is performed here in the original version heard at the 1817 premiere.

About Luciano Acocella

In 1996 Luciano Acocella won the International Prokofiev and Dimitri Mitropoulos conducting competitions which led to his appointment as assistant to Daniele Gatti. He has conducted extensively across Europe, Asia and the US to critical acclaim. He was general music director of the Opera de Rouen-Haute Normandie between 2011 and 2015. At the Rossini in Wildbad festival he has conducted Le Comte Ory and the acclaimed Naxos recordings of Adelaide di Borgogna (8.660401-02) and Demetrio e Polibio (8.660405-06).

Key Features:

- Giacomo Meyerbeer is widely known to give a 'decisive character' to grand operas with his later works, but his early Italian opera were as much a success. This world premiere recording of Romilda e Constanza is performed at the 2019 Rossini in Wildbad Festival, using the original version heard at the 1817 premiere.
- Opera News praised the cast: 'Patrick Kabongo was a superb Teobaldo. During this, his third year at Wildbad, his vocal and artistic development has been a joy to hear. His limpid vocal production and sense of reaching out beyond the footlights to communicate with the public, gave enormous



pleasure. Javier Povedano's fine bass-baritone voice also fulfilled the promise evident last year... both his acting and singing were beyond reproach. Among the secondary characters, Mexican baritone Emmanuel Franco and Russian bass Timophey Pavlenko stood out as artists to look out for in the future.

The title roles were sang by Chiara Brunello (Romilda) and Luiza Fatyol (Constanza). Opera News noted that the duo displayed 'some lovely, soft-grained singing'. Online Musik Magazin added Fatyol





sang 'with agile coloratura' and Brunello 'shines...with dark mezzo-soprano and great flexibility in the fast runs.'



The Brahms Trio – Nikolai Sachenko, Violin Kirill Rodin, Cello Natalia Rubinstein, Piano

The piano trio holds an important place in the history of Russian chamber music and to follow the development of the genre is to accompany the fascinating history of Russian music in the 19th century. Its beginnings can be found with Alexander Alyabiev, a student of John Field, whose unfinished but elegant and vivacious *Piano Trio in E flat major* is paired with the yearning Romanticism of the *Piano Trio in A minor*. Mikhail Glinka's *Trio pathétique* bears the inscription 'I have only known love through the sorrow it causes!', while Anton Rubinstein's elaborately acrobatic piano writing in his *Piano Trio in G minor* reminds us of his own virtuosity, and reveals his magnificent skills as a melodist.

About The Brahms Trio

The Brahms Trio is one of the leading Russian chamber ensembles, comprising violinist Nikolai Sachenko and cellist Kirill Rodin, both winners of the Gold Medal at the International Tchaikovsky Competition in Moscow, and pianist Natalia Rubinstein, First Prize winner of the Joseph Joachim Chamber Music Competition in Weimar and founder of the ensemble. Since its foundation in 1990, the trio has regularly appeared at prestigious international concert venues, such as the Grand Hall of the Moscow Conservatory, the Brucknerhaus Linz and Seoul Arts Center, as well as at festivals in Melbourne, Hong Kong, Istanbul, Copenhagen, Paris and London. Legendary musicians such as Tatiana Gaidamovich, Alexander Bonduriansky (Moscow Trio), Valentin Berlinsky (Borodin Quartet) and Rudolf Barshai have had a significant influence on the formation of the performing style and career of the trio. The Brahms Trio has made an invaluable contribution to enlarging the chamber repertoire by rediscovering unknown piano trios of Russian composers of the late 19th and early 20th century, and recipients of the Honoured Artist of Russia title.






Key Features:

- This first volume in our new anthology History of the Russian Piano Trio is the first of its kind to be released on disc. The series is compiled chronologically and will include a number of world premiere recordings, and is dedicated to a particular period in the history of Russian music and features both well-known scores and rare editions and manuscripts.
- The series will consist of five instalments, and this first volume is dedicated to repertoire of the 19th century, opening the edition with works by composers who stood at the dawn of Russian music and the founding of its professional musical education and academic traditions: Anton Rubinstein, the author of the first Russian opera and the founder of the Russian symphony style; Mikhail Glinka, viewed as the first great Russian composer of art music; and Alexander Alyabiev, the author of the first Russian piano trio ever, written in 1815, and whose piano trios are otherwise unavailable in the record catalogues.
- This is The Brahms Trio's Naxos debut, but ever since its foundation more than 25 years ago the ensemble has been highly acclaimed for its outstanding artistry, and considered one of Russia's leading chamber music ensembles. The trio won the International Chamber Music Competition in Trapani, Italy in 1993, and in 1995 awarded First Prize at the Joseph Joachim Chamber Music Competition in Weimar. 'Among chamber ensembles that play sufficiently elitist music, there are rarely performers like the Brahms Trio who can make the composer's refined thought accessible to the audience' (Anna Vetkhova, Kultura Newspaper, Moscow, Russia).

Engelbert Humperdinck won a worldwide reputation through his application of Wagnerian techniques to folk music in Hänsel und Gretel. But he wrote far more widely for the stage than is acknowledged, and this selection focuses on long overlooked works that reveal Humperdinck's flair for romance, comedy and innovation. These include music for one of the first full-colour silent films, the spectacular Das Wunder (1912); the passionate, ethereal small cantata Die Wallfahrt nach Kevlaar; the rich antique flavour of Lysistrata; as well as his dance-saturated and serenely beautiful incidental music for Der Kaufmann von Venedig.

About Dario Salvi

Dario Salvi is a Scottish-Italian conductor, musicologist and researcher who specialises in the restoration and performance of rare works. His passion is the rediscovery and performance of long-forgotten masterpieces by the likes of Suppé, Meyerbeer, Rumshinsky, Genée, Auber, and many others. He is collaborating with Naxos on recording a series on Romantic ballets, including works by Minkus, Pugni, Adam and others, and a series on Auber's overtures and orchestral music. Two other important projects include recording the last three missing operas by Johann Strauss II and three never before recorded operatic works by Giacomo Meyerbeer.

Conductor Dario Salvi has recorded quite a few large-scale works for Naxos. His first recording, Meyerbeer's Sacred Works on 8.573907, also featured the soprano Andrea Chudak: 'Dario Salvi's arrangements work very well; they sound like they could have been written by Meyerbeer



himself and they never get in the way of the texts' (American Record Guide).

- He has also conducted two volumes of Auber's overtures Vol. 1 is on 8.574005: 'The musicians play this music with wonderful spirit, and the performances sound both well-rehearsed and spontaneous' (Fanfare). Vol. 2 is on 8.574006: 'Salvi's interpretation of Auber's music is very refined indeed and one can hear the attention to detail and level of personal research that has gone into the performance in every track on the disc'. - One of Salvi's major projects is the world premiere recording of Johann Strauss II's Blindekuh ('Blind Man's Buff'), released on 8.660434-35. His tempo allows the beautiful Straussian melodies to emerge with elegance and a dose of humour that is always present... Charming and will delight fans of the genre'.
- Dario Salvi's most recent release is Ingeborg von Bronsart's opera Jery und Bätely (8.660476), which also included impressive performances from soloists Harrie van der Plas and Ruxandra Voda van der Plas, and the Malmö Opera Orchestra.







These four works represent all of Sir William Walton's chamber music involving both violin and piano, as well as being a microcosm of his compositional output between 1918 and 1950. They offer a fascinating glimpse of Walton's stylistic journey, from the youthful exuberance of the early *Piano Quartet* and the *Toccata* to the unconventional but masterful *Violin Sonata*, and the *Two Pieces* with their connection to his music for films. Matthew Jones and Annabel Thwaite's recording of works by Benjamin Britten (Naxos 8.573136) was summed up as 'superb' by *BBC Music Magazine*.

Key Features:

Many of the works in this programme are not unfamiliar on recordings, but this is the first single-disc release to include all of the composer's chamber works involving both violin and piano. The presence of the often overlooked *Toccata* is unusual, and shows a dimension of Walton's music that is rarely given mention. The disc is the result of a Guildhall School research project entitled 'Walton: his voice through the violin', inspired by violinist **Matthew Jones**'s lifelong love of Walton's music.







- Matthew Jones can also be heard on Prokofiev's Romeo and Juliet arranged for viola and piano (8.572318) and his recital of English viola music (8.572579), regarded as a programme of 'consistently fine performances, beautifully recorded' by Gramophone.
- Viola player Sarah-Jane Bradley has also made numerous recordings for Naxos, including a recital of English music (8.572761) in which her 'viola has a singing quality beautifully suited to this essentially ruminative, lyrical repertoire' (*Gramophone*).
 Cellist Tim Lowe performs regularly in the UK and Europe, and has recorded chamber music album for various labels.

Between 1849 and 1853 Robert and Clara Schumann wrote a series of striking and imaginative works for violin and piano. Clara's expressive *Romanzen* explores the violin's lower and middle range, while Robert's own set of the same name balances turbulence with melancholy. His concentration at this time on Hausmusik also led to the *Fantasiestücke*, originally cast for clarinet, and the fairy-tale narratives of *Märchenbilder*. The passionate complexity of the *Violin Sonata No. 3 in A minor* suggests new musical paths the composer didn't live to fully explore.

Key Features:

• Violinist Haoli Lin is an internationally recognised talent. The youngest winner of the China National Violin Competition in 2008, and the winner of the Andrews University International Violin Concert in 2013, Haoli Lin has performed in prestigious concert halls throughout China, Southeast Asia and the US. He has served as guest concertmaster with The Jakarta Symphony in Indonesia and the Xiamen Philharmonic Orchestra in China. Haoli Lin is the founder and artistic



director of the New World Chamber Players and has led the ensemble on three tours of China. A Starling Scholar on a full scholarship, Haoli Lin is currently completing his doctoral degree at the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, studying with the pre-eminent violin pedagogue Kurt Sassmannshaus. Haoli Lin's 2016 release *Romantic Journey* was highly praised by *Fanfare* magazine.

Born in China, Jianan Liu began studying piano at the age of five. As a chamber pianist, he has performed with the New World Chamber Players throughout China, appearing in recitals in Shenzhen, Guangzhou, Shantou, Fuzhou, Shanghai, Chongqing, Nanchang, Wuhan and Qingdao. He was awarded prizes at the 6th Asia-Pacific International F. Chopin Piano Competition in Japan in 2005 and the 4th Hong Kong International Piano Competition in 2008.

The first volume (8.551400) with Vinzenz Lachner's arrangements of Ludwig van Beethoven's *Piano Concertos* for piano and string quintet already showed that this would be quite a special complete recording of Beethoven's piano concertos – and not just because it is the first recording to present this version for the first time ever. For the second volume, Hanna Shybayeva chose the piano trio version of the second symphony in D major Op. 36 to be added in the arrangement by the master himself. After all, this chamber music arrangement from Beethoven's pen fits perfectly with those of the piano concertos of later times.

Key Features:

Having begun her international career at the age of eleven, Hanna Shybayeva has transformed from a child prodigy to a mature and exciting musician. She won many international prizes and performed at many festivals, as well as giving solo recitals and concert-performances with orchestras around the world. Shybayeva was awarded grants from UNESCO/New Names (Moscow), the George Soros Foundation, the Vladimir Spivakov International Charity Foundation, the Youri Egorov Foundation, Yamaha Music Europe and the Prince Bernhard Culture Fund. Her many recordings include a collection of Tango pieces on the Grand Piano label (GP794).



Vol. 1 of this series (8.551400) featured the Third and Fourth Piano Concertos. It received 4 stars from Pizzicato, commenting: 'Such a performance can be rewarding if the musical parameters are actually right, which is the case in this recording. The dialogue between the pianist and the strings works very well, and the latter contribute significantly to the expressiveness of the music. While the playing of the strings has density and fullness it is also remarkably transparent ... Hanna Shybayeva never plays herself into the foreground and is always out to focus Beethoven's messages together with her colleagues.'

Their passion for the life and works of women composers connects the musicians of trioW. The fascinating life-stories and compositional tours de force prompted Katharina Wimmer, Stefan Welsch and Ingrid Wendel to include more and more of these works in their concert repertoire. Since the Romantic period – in spite of the prejudice against women who composed – some compositions by women were justifiably regarded with great interest, most, however, disappeared again relatively quickly from the concert halls. This disc allows us to enjoy the sound of these *Unheard-of Treasures* for violin and piano, for cello and piano as well as for piano trio: Amanda Maier (1853–1894), Clara Schumann (1819–1896), Amy Beach (1867–1944), Lili Boulanger (1893–1918) und Dora Pejačević (1885–1923).

Key Features:

- Ingrid Wendel regularly gives concerts with chamber music groups in various configurations. In the last few years she has focussed particularly on the genre of modern music known as "Neue Musik" and has worked in collaboration with composers in several premiere performances. Together with Katharina Wimmer, she founded the duoW in 2013. Since then, the two of them have devised numerous concert programmes and have also released an album titled Viva la musica.
- Stefan Welsch is a sought-after soloist as well as player in chamber music groups and has given concerts in several European countries including Germany, France, Spain and Denmark. In 2018 he joined Katharina Wimmer and Ingrid Wendel expanding their duoW into the trioW.

André Parfenov presents the Mephistopheles cycle as an overall picture of human life - from birth to death. This does not result in transcriptions, but real, artistic, compositional work, a conversation and sometimes even a discussion between the 19th and the 21st century. A true epochal dialogue in which the words of the contemporary composer have no less weight and clarity than that of Franz Liszt. At the same time, Liszt-Parfenov's Mephistopheles cycle is not just a reflection on the original, which was the starting point of the artistic search, but a further thinking and an expansion of the philosophical framework. André Parfenov's partner in the Liszt Duet is the outstanding violinist Iuliana Münch. The listener immediately hears that a first-class ensemble has been found here, which in some places presents excessive passion and in other places acts with calm prudence, which in both cases is not only based on pure technical knowledge, but on an absolute understanding of the music.

Key Features:

- The motto for all performances of the Parfenov Duo is "The composer on stage". This describes not only the fact that a large part of the works performed were written by André Parfenov, but also his treatment of works by other composers which are part of the Duo's concert programmes and are explored in humorous detail, in conversation with the audience. Arrangements for violin and piano or piano solo make these works sound quite new and fresh. With this approach, the Duo allows us to experience an era when the composer and the musician were one entity on stage.
- Parfenov Duo have previously released two albums for Naxos. Pizzicato wrote that the duo 'present an enjoyable new listening experience' for their first album The Piano Legend of the Violin (8.551396), while the most recent The Genesis of the Goldberg Variations (8.551399) earned praise from the American Record Guide ('It is well recorded and a very good, consistently interesting Goldberg Variations with a substantial new set of variations on the theme we all revere.')

Carmina Predulcia Music from the Schedel Songbook

Around 1500 Hartmann Schedel (1440-1514) was one of the most important polymath of his time. Grown up in Nuremberg as son of a wealthy Nuremberg merchant, Schedel studied liberal arts and medicine in Leipzig and Padua from 1456 to 1566. Being a polymath and a conscientious archivist of his time Schedel collected the contemporary knowledge by compiling a vast collection of books with more than 600 volumes. One of these surviving books is the Song Book bearing Schedel's name. According to sources, Schedel showed no great interest in music. It seems that he wrote down the songs of his compendium primarily out of documentary interest and that with a lasting success as two thirds of the lyrics have been surviving for posterity until today.

Key Features:

- Almara is an early music ensemble which was founded by Elisabeth Pawelke during her studies at the Schola Cantorum Basiliensis. The ensemble's musical focus is on the secular repertoire of the Middle Ages and the Renaissance.

Ars Nova Copenhagen · Paul Hillier

A collection of sacred music by Arvo Pärt, Julia Wolfe, Caroline Shaw, interspersed with songs from the Laudario di Cortona, Italy. The six pieces by Arvo Pärt can be described as having been composed 'lately'. The six laude sung here are part of an extensive collection that was compiled during the 13th century, nowadays known as the *Laudario di Cortona*. Its location for nearly five centuries is unclear, and its rediscovery in 1876 was a considerable piece of luck. Caroline Shaw is a New York composer who also regularly performs as singer and violinist. Her *Partita for 8 Voices* won the Pulitzer Prize in 2013. Ars Nova first performed music by Julia Wolfe when they premiered her *Thirst* in 2009. This was part of *Water*, a larger commission from Bang On A Can composer. *Guard My Tongue* was written around the same time, with text derived from *Psalm 34*.

Key Features:

Paul Hillier was founding director of the Hilliard Ensemble and Theatre of Voices. Currently he is chief conductor of Ars Nova Copenhagen and Chamber Choir Ireland. In 2006 he was awarded an OBE for services to choral music. In 2007 he received the Order of the White Star of Estonia, and was awarded a GRAMMY for Best Choral Recording. In 2010 he was awarded his second GRAMMY – for best new music recording (with Theatre of Voices). In 2013 he was awarded the Order of Dannebrog (the Danish knighthood).





Franz Liszt inherited strong religious convictions from his father, and the influence of sacred narratives can be found throughout his compositions. Drawn from the so-called *Tasso Sketchbook*, the *Préludes et Harmonies poétiques et religieuses* were composed after the end of Liszt's relationship with Marie d'Agoult, and include the passionately turbulent *Langueur?* Descriptive titles characterise many of the brief *Album-Leaves*, while the legend of *St François de Paule marchant sur les flots* depicts the saint crossing the Straits of Messina using his cloak as a sail after being refused passage by a boatman.

Including fragments, this is a further collection of Liszt rarities that offers fascinating pre-echoes of later masterpieces, exploring the composer's wider responses to religious themes, Romantic poetry and the intensity of his own circumstances.
- Young Russian pianist Roman Kosyakov appears on the Naxos label for the first time in this recording, and is one of the featured artists in the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire series. Charles-Marie WIDOR (1844-1937)

Widor's cycle of organ symphonies sits at the heart of his compositional achievement. They are vivid and innovative – none more so than *Symphony No. 8 in B major*, which takes performer and listener alike to the limits of the genre: its glittering sonorities, lyric intensity and technical power offer a tour-deforce of organ writing. The artfully woven *Symphonie romane*, the last of the ten, utilises a Gregorian chorale in music of increasing splendour, melancholy and, finally, sublime peace.

Christian von Blohn graduated from the Musikakademie Saarbrücken in 1987 with a first-class degree in Church Music and also with a degree in Music Education, majoring in the organ. Krzysztof Komendarek-Tymendorf, Viola

Polish violist Krzysztof Komendarek-Tymendorf's debut solo album highlights two major works for the solo viola repertoire. Soviet composer Fyodor Druzhinin is a renowned violist with whom Shostakovich dedicated his Viola Sonata. His Sonata for Viola Solo, written in 1959, reveals Druzhinin to be a highly talented composer whose virtuoso treatment of the viola is second to none. Weinberg's close association with Druzhinin has also led to the compositions of the four Solo Viola Sonatas (No. 1 dedicated for and edited by Druzhinin), each piece having a unique and individual style from another. Sonata No. 3, Op. 135 combines technical and emotional challenges to the performer.

Christophe Dejour, Guitar

Christophe Dejour's arrangements of music by Albéniz (8.557064) and Granados (8.557709) performed by Trio Campanella have won much acclaim. For this recording he has made three pioneering arrangements that further expand the instrument's repertoire and compass. Dejour's arrangement of Gesualdo's Canzon Francese del Principe is both expressive and idiomatic, and he explores two great 20th-century works in Berg's milestone Piano Sonata, Op. 1 and Bartók's profound and complex Sonata for Solo Violin which was inspired by Bach.






